Prayer Team – EK Beall. First of all, many thank you's to Liz Bosch for handling the prayer requests received during the summer months, and for submitting the report for the months of June, July, and August. There was no Parish Care Meeting in September 2024. The total number of on-going Prayer Support Team requests for beginning of September was 190. The total number of new requests during September was eight (8) (of which 3 were updates, making the total number of new requests five (5), making the grand total of 195. The members of the Prayer Support Team continue to faithfully pray daily for those on their prayer lists, as well as contacting them throughout the month with phone calls, emails, or personal visits. It is truly a privilege to pray for our parish family and their loved ones, offering our comfort and support in their time of need.

Comfort Care Meals - Barbara Rao. No activity for food needs during September 2024.
